

June 2022 Police Crime Report

(Crime report 21st June – 30th June not supplied by Police due to leave)

Monday 20 June 2022

- A burglary was discovered at a Coldstream Road address where a lawn mower, bicycles and a child's motorbike were stolen.

Saturday 18 June 2022 to Sunday 19 June 2022

- A vehicle parked at a property on South Belt was damaged when the offender/s put expanding foam into the exhaust, doors, and key holes.
- A 2006 black BMW was stolen from Smarts Drive, Leithfield.
- Toilet cubicles were tagged at the Trousellot Park public toilets in Rangiora and the Hinemoa toilets in Kaiapoi.
- A suspicious car was seen traveling around Swamp Road in Loburn.
- A member of the public witnessed a vehicle doing skids in Rangiora. The number plate was recorded, and police are following a strong line of enquiry.
